THE SCHOOL OF LAW

On May 26, four students, Dave Cornfeld, Margaret Echigo-shima, Stanley Morgan, and Neal Willis were graduated from this law school and all are now employed.

On September 24, six members of the senior class, George Beckham, William Costello, Sherrill Friedman, Barbara Goldberg, Robert Kilker and Samuel Wool will receive their diplomas. These persons took their last law school examination on September 3 which in all probability marks the end of their formal law school education. It is worthy of notice that of these six persons constituting the entire law school graduating class for Sept. 1943, only one, Barbara Goldberg, the femme sole of the class, will be available for work in private practice. All of the fellows with the exception of Mr. Beckham, who is already a practicing attorney, will become a part of our naval forces within a matter of just a few weeks. Mr. Beckham, incidentally, awaits a call into the Army, and will endeavor to enter that branch of the service being trained for administration of occupied territories.

Conspicuously missing was the carefree attitude of the pre-war days. The cane raising ceremony was held although very much modified in its form and tenor.
